

The Vatican Grants a Nihil Obstat to Medjugorje

On May 17, 2024, the Vatican issued new rules for judging apparitions. Under the new rules, the highest level of approval that could be granted to any such phenomenon is "nihil obstat," that there is "nothing standing in the way," or "nothing impeding" belief in the vision or apparition as an authentic encounter with the Heavenly."

On September 19, 2024 the Vatican announced during a lengthy press conference in Rome, at the Dicastery for the Doctrine of the Faith, that the apparitions in Medjugorje received a nihil obstat!!!

Since the document is so long, it might be good to share

a few excerpts. You can read the entire text of the document by going to the official site for Medjugorje, www.medjugorje.hr. At this writing (9/20) it is on their home page, and will most likely be there for a while. (The Vatican link is quite long.)

Foreword: 1. The time has come to conclude a long and complex history that has surrounded the spiritual phenomena of Medjugorje. It is a history in which bishops, theologians, commissions, and analysts have expressed a series of divergent opinions.

The conclusions expressed in this Note are presented in the context of what was established in the new Norms for Proceeding in the Discernment of Alleged Supernatural Phenomena (Dicastery for the Doctrine of the Faith, 17 May 2024; henceforth, "Norms"). Consequently, the perspective of this analysis is quite different from that which was used in earlier studies.

It is important to clarify from the outset that the conclusions of this Note do not imply a judgment about the moral life of the alleged visionaries. Additionally, when recognizing an action of the Spirit for the good of the People of God "in the midst of" a spiritual experience, present from its beginnings until now, we should remember that the charismatic gifts (gratiae gratis datae) that may be connected to that experience do not necessarily require those involved to have moral perfection.

18. In this journey, prayer is fundamental. The exhortation to pray is both constant and insistent in the messages:

"I call on you once again to decide for prayer because, with prayer, you will be able to experience conversion. Each of you will become, in simplicity, similar to a child who is open to the Father's love" (25 July 1996).

"I call on you to fill your day with short, ardent prayers. When you pray, your heart is open, and God loves you with a special love and gives you special graces. Therefore, make good use of this time of grace and dedicate it to God as never before" (25 July 2005).

19. Along with prayer, the call to *fast* appears frequently, but it is explained as a freely given offering in addition to sacrifices of a physical nature: "If you are in distress or in need, come to me. If you do not have the strength to fast on bread and water, you can give up other things. Besides food, it would be good to give up television because after watching television programs, you are distracted and cannot pray. You could also give up alcohol, cigarettes, and

other pleasures. You yourselves know what you must do" (8 December 1981).

20. For the faithful, praver finds its culmination in the celebration of the Eucharist:

"The Mass is the highest form of prayer. You will never be able to understand its greatness" (13 January 1984). "Dear children, also today, in a special way, I wish to call you to the Eucharist. May the Mass be the center of your lives! In particular, dear children, may the Eucharist be in your families. The family must go to Holy Mass and celebrate Jesus. Jesus must be the center of your lives!" (15 June 2018).

"May Holy Mass not be a habit for you, but life. By living the Holy Mass every day, you will feel the need for holiness" (25 January 1998). "Do not forget that the Eucharist, in which is the heart of the faith, my Son is always with you.



He comes to you and breaks bread with you; because, my children, it was for your sake that he died, rose again, and comes anew" (2 May 2016).

21. The following message underscores the minor value of the apparitions themselves when compared with the immense spiritual treasure that is the Eucharist:

"I am closer to you during the Mass than during an apparition. Many pilgrims would like to be present in the small room of the apparitions, and so they crowd around the rectory. When they swarm in front of the tabernacle, as they now do in front of the rectory, then they will have understood everything; they will have understood the presence of Jesus, because receiving Holy Communion is greater than being a visionary" (12 November 1986).

38. Through the Nihil obstat about a spiritual event, the faithful "are authorized to give it their adherence in a prudent manner" (Norms, art. 22, §1; cf. Benedict XVI, Verbum Domini, par. 14). While this does not imply a declaration of the supernatural character of the phenomenon in question (cf. Norms, art. 22, §2)-and recalling that the faithful are not obliged to believe in it-the Nihil obstat indicates that the faithful can receive a positive encouragement for their Christian life through this spiritual proposal, and it authorizes public acts of devotion. Such a determination is possible insofar as many positive fruits have been noted in the midst of a spiritual experience, while negative and dangerous effects have not spread among the People of God.

Evaluating the abundant and widespread fruits, which are so beautiful and positive, does not imply that the alleged supernatural events are declared authentic. Instead, it only highlights that the Holy Spirit is acting fruitfully for the good of the faithful "in the midst" of this spiritual phenomenon of Medjugorje. For this reason, all are invited to appreciate and share the pastoral value of this spiritual proposal (cf. Norms, par. 17).

As of September 25, 2024, the number of Masses reported for Our Lady's intentions was 40,219. Thank you.

Fr. Michael Della Penna's Vocation Testimony

The following is excerpted from a testimony by Fr. Michael Della Penna on Fruit of Medjugorje (Episode #571, aired on 8/4/24). We recommend you go to <u>Marytv.tv</u> to hear the entire testimony (too long to include here).

Hello everyone. My name is Fr. Michael Della Penna. I'm from Boston, and I'm really delighted that I get a chance to share a little bit of what happened to me through Medjugorje.

I can begin way back in 1989 when I was a college student and I was living next door to one of my best friends. In the middle of the night, he actually knocked on my door and felt that he was being called to Medjugorje. At that time, I had never even heard of the word, so my response really was "Medju-what?" I never thought of anything like that, and I saw in him a beautiful emotion. I saw him really feel that he had an encounter with God and, of course, having grown up with him, I immediately felt drawn, and I knew I was going to go. That was in April of 1989.

He convinced his entire family, six others, so there were eight of us altogether, and we wound up traveling there in September of 1989 – his family and myself. While we were there, I would say the first three days maybe, we didn't feel too much, but it was pretty impressive to see all of the different nationalities, all the different countries. You could definitely experience the universality of our faith and how it transcended country and language. That was pretty impressive. But for the first three days, we didn't feel much until my friend, Rick, and I decided that we were hungry. It was late at night, and we had thought we had read something about there being a pizza place open. We wound up looking for it with our flashlights. Of course there was nothing, especially at that time, so we decided to climb Mt. Krizevac. It was one of the first times I ever actually prayed the Stations of the Cross going up and we found it very

prayerful. We were talking about life and God and different experiences.

When we got to the top of the mountain, that's where we were just looking at the sun, as the sun rose over the horizon. I remember being awed by the fact that you could stare directly at the sun. I always describe it as almost a little host sitting right in front of the sun, kind of just moving a little bit. But there was a certain mellow peacefulness about that experience. And as we looked at the sun, I looked at the sun – I saw the sun kind of just go like this

(gesturing), move around like that. Of course I looked at Rick. I said, "Did you just see that?" And he had. At that moment, I always describe it, it wasn't as if I felt anything bad. It was the contrary. I felt that we were witnessing this beautiful miracle, if you will, solar phenomenon, and it really touched me.

We ended up going down the mountain and while we were there, I always describe it as each one of us experienced something that awakened in our heart the truth. It came affirming in me the reality that God is real, the Eucharist is real, Mary is real. One person described it as you almost go from black and white to color. It was a good analogy I think in a sense. It's a metaphor that, all of a sudden, everything comes alive. You look at your life in a different way through a different lens. You see a new paradigm of reality. So that conversion experience really awakened me to the truth of what I suspected. I thought God was real, and I used to go to church once in a while, but I wound up going to Confession here, and it was a beautiful emptying, if you will, and I'll never forget the priest asking me afterwards if I had a spiritual director. At that time, I didn't even know what a spiritual director was, and I told him I didn't. He said to me, "When you go back to Boston, get one."

In other experiences here, I would say there was a profound sense of – I'm sure everyone's been saying for the last 43 years – there's a supernatural, beautiful deep peace, indescribable. That's something I think I've felt – it's been kind of like a thread of continuity through all of the visits when I come back here. There's a stillness, sort of like existential I would describe it, as if everything is OK, like you're supposed to be here, everything's the way it is supposed to be, that sense of perduring reality of this is where God wants you and it fits well in your soul, if you will.

I also often describe it as you're walking or you're sitting and you feel like right around the corner you can see or meet Jesus – that "Heaven on earth" experience. And that, of course, keeps me coming back, I guess, besides the fact that you get to experience so many others, so many other people get re-awakened to that truth. They see God for the first time or they experience God in that transformation. For me, it never gets old – seeing someone awake to that truth is remarkable.

Right now, we're in a group. We have about 41, and my cousin – to watch her experience God and try to integrate that into her life is life-changing for me because I see the joy that she's discovering, as I did back in 1989.

So all of those experiences, so-called "coincidences" – as we open up the Scriptures and it will be speaking to our hearts – all of that, I brought back with me to Boston. But I was in a situation where I had been – I had just recently broken up with my girlfriend and I was confused...I really wanted to go back with my girlfriend. I know that what I experienced was real. I didn't really know how to integrate that into my life. I didn't know what that meant – that I saw the sun, that I was awakened to this

new truth. Matter of fact, I couldn't reconcile that with all of my friends and college life. So one day I'd be partying and hanging out with everybody and doing my old things, and then the next day, I'd be like, "I want to give myself to God," and it was going back and forth.

So I did take the advice of that confessor. I got a spiritual director, and I was working it out with him. He was very good and kind of slowing me down. One of the analogies he gave me on a retreat was that we are all like diamonds in the rough. I always took that to heart, meaning that at one and the same time, it was a way to kind of affirm our knowledge that we are these precious gems to God, and yet at the same time, when you find a diamond in the rough, it has probably dirt and rock stuck to it, and it's necessary that there has to

be a process of purification. So that became a nice metaphor for me in my life as I continued on that last year, senior year, in school.

I was slowly trying to make sense of everything that happens. I graduated and wound up working for the church at St. Leonard's, and I was doing odd jobs – painting, stripping the floors...all these kinds of things. But what it gave me the opportunity to do is, at 12:00, I'd go to Mass. And that's where I really felt that peace. That's where everything felt right. I kept on getting fed by the Word over that course of time. Then I began to speak to another priest about the possibility of thinking about a vocation and he wound up inviting me to discern for the month of December. So what I did, during that month, I just focused, I opened myself, I read Scripture, I tried to listen. I tried to be open to wherever God was calling.

I had a few experiences, one of which was very formative...I just thought of becoming a Eucharistic Minister at that time and we'd bring it to the shut-ins. I was in rehab...I'll never forget this moment where I came in this room and there was an elderly gentleman and he was dying...he had a beautiful spirit about him. He shared his life with me... and we had so many things in common...There were so many similarities, commonalities, and then towards the end of the conversation, after I'd given him Communion, he shared with me that when he was young, he had discerned a vocation. He had thought about becoming a priest, but never did. He kind of regretted that he did not give himself to God. I remember going home and letting that really interiorize, digest, ponder that experience. I realized that could be me when I was older, regretting this invitation from God to follow Him more intimately...

So that's when I joined the Franciscans in 1991, and I kind of put it in my head I would give it like 2 years... I would say that after the first four months, I knew this was exactly what I wanted to do. Everything just fit for me and I loved it and I still love it! I love being a Franciscan. I love the experience of always being able to learn about God. I love the opportunity to deep-dive into His Word. It's a neverending richness where He has unfathomable mysteries that are always awaiting us. He invites us to explore it...So for me it was a doorway in a sense, to be invited to journey into God and to explore all of the depths of His love and to receive that at the same time, ministering in such a beautiful way to serve Our Lord, where I've found I always receive much more than I gave. In giving of yourself, you really do receive so much more back. It's such a fulfilling, beautiful vocation...

What does it mean that She keeps coming? I've been contemplating that actually, I think like all pilgrims. There's a few things that come to mind. Like a good mother, She repeats what She's been saying, probably because we're not

listening. She can see that those messages...the very last one [6/25/24] I found so penetrating. She said again that peace is being threatened and She said there's an attack on the family and She's saying put God in the first place. Those three alone I think are life changing in the

sense that when you do put God in the first place, everything else lines up. That's when you have peace in your heart, that's when your family is grounded in the truth...

What is it about our time that is so perilous? ... I remember

there's a beautiful homily that a bishop gave when I was in Assisi right after the earthquake, when they had a huge statue of Mary over the Basilica of the Portiuncula. It was gold-leaf colored and they took it down because they were afraid it was going to fall. The bishop took that opportunity to say, "In the time of trouble, our Mother comes down from Heaven to be with Her children." I do see all of this in the context that She wants to guide us in a special way. It really is a school of prayer...When She speaks about conversion and She talks about putting Scripture in a visible place, She's telling us what we know intuitively, but we probably haven't applied. How many of us really read the Bible every day? Everybody can, but we don't. That's the key. It's putting habits into concrete action so that we can get His Word inside of us. She knows that's what's going to give us the grounding, that's what's going to open our heart, that's what's going to bring healing, that's what's going to bring peace...We might see them as very simplified or even basic.

It reminds me of Naaman when he was told to wash himself in the water seven times and he rebelled. He thought it was too silly...he thought it was too easy. I think the messages that Our Lady gives us are often, maybe even 80% of the

time, they kind of brush aside – too simple, too easy, and we don't put them into practice. But there's an infinite depth to doing so. It reminds me that you can't see the beauty of a church and its stained glass windows unless you're inside... if the sun's out, the vibrancy, the dynamism of those colors from within can be just unimaginably beautiful... When you're in that prayer, when you enrich yourself with the Word, when you submerge yourself into that beauty, then all of a sudden, life becomes transformed.

We had a beautiful homily today by an Irish priest. He said, "Cleanse yourself." There's an experience, a depth of intimacy that we can all have access to by simply divulging, cleansing, emptying, that comes through the Sacrament [of Reconciliation]. That's why She's saying it...They're the Sacraments of the Church offered to us the last 2,000 years, that I think some of us take for granted...We see them as too simple a solution for such a complicated problem...I'm always really blown away by the analogy that the most sophisticated computer in the world...it's all based on two things: zero and one. It comes down to such a basic simplicity. I think for us, our spiritual lives can be very much reduced. It's simple – avoid evil and do good. Take that message into our heart and apply it...



Miracle at the Carmel in Quito!

For this month dedicated to Our Lady of the Rosary, I would like to recall one of Mary's most beautiful missions in Latin America, that has saved many Christian communities

over many years: In 1984, the Quito Carmel "Carmen Alto" was withering away. The novitiate had to be closed. Not a single vocation to be seen! However, the Prioress, Mother

Maria Helena del Corazón de Jesús, regained hope when an Italian nun, Sister Luicela, told her that she was going on a pilgrimage to Medjugorje. She immediately asked her to pray for vocations while she was there, and she even entrusted her with a letter to give to one of the visionaries for the Blessed Virgin.

In Medjugorje, Sister Luicela was able to attend a public apparition. When the visionary shared Mary's words during the apparition, the sister was deeply moved! The message was indeed timely: "I will take care of the communities that will pray together the three Mysteries of the Rosary [Joyful, Sorrowful, and Glorious] every day, for the intentions of my Immaculate Heart, and I will choose their vocations myself."

Overjoyed by these heavenly words, Sister Luicela communicated them to the Prioress of the Carmel who did not delay in gathering the sisters and offered to pray the three parts of the Rosary every day, together. The sisters all gladly accepted Mary's request. They changed their daily schedule in order to fit in this new practice. And that is how a period of great Marian fervor began in this Carmel.

A few months later, the first vocation arrived, Sr. Maria de los Angeles, followed by other young sisters. There were so many vocations that after a few years, the prioress had to establish another Carmel, in Santo Domingo, Ecuador. When this new Carmel also reached a number of sisters greater than 21 (the maximum allowed), it became necessary to establish another Carmel, this time in Panama. It goes without saying that in these new Carmelite convents, the tradition of praying the three Mysteries of the Rosary every day together, remains very much alive!

During my mission in Galilee in 2017, a sister of the Carmel of Haifa confided to me: "I am a fruit of this message and of this prayer that Mary gave us, because I entered the Carmel of Santo Domingo." Then she told me the whole story.

A few years ago, faced with such blessings, the Poor Clares of Quito decided to adopt this prayer, according to Mary's message in Medjugorje, in order to obtain vocations. Needless to say, they were well answered!

Why does Our Lady so often repeat "*Dear children, live my messages*"? Today more than ever, the Rosary, as a weapon, is necessary, given the stakes involved in the raging spiritual battle. We cannot neglect any track to victory. May this golden key, offered by the Queen of the Rosary, inspire many of Her children who are struggling and becoming discouraged! *Children of Medjugorje, <u>sremmanuel.com</u>, October 2022 report.*

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MARY IS CALLING YOU

On June 24, 1981 in Medjugorje, Our Lady began appearing to six children. She identified Herself as the Blessed Virgin, Queen of Peace. Her words to the visionaries: "I have come to tell the world that God exists. He is the fullness of life, and to enjoy this fullness and obtain peace, you must return to God."

Today, the Blessed Mother still appears daily to three of the visionaries, and annually to the others. They are all now adults. During the apparitions, the visionaries do not react to light, don't hear any sound, or react to being touched; they feel that they are outside of time and space. They declare to see the Blessed Virgin as they see other people — three dimensional. They pray and speak with Her.

The Blessed Mother granted to confide ten secrets to each visionary (some are chastisements for the world). Some of the visionaries have received all ten secrets. Our Lady promised to leave a visible sign at the original site of the apparitions in Medjugorje, for all humanity. In the meantime, this period of grace is for conversion and a deepening of faith.

Father Jozo Zovko, who was the pastor of St. James when the apparitions began, has spoken about what he calls "the weapons" or "the five stones" of Our Lady (as in the story of Goliath). They are PRAYER with the heart, especially the Rosary; EUCHARIST; BIBLE; monthly CONFESSION; and FASTING.

On September 19, 2024 the Vatican announced that the apparitions in Medjugorje received a nihil obstat.
